All maps are published by OS or on an OS base unless the contrary is stated.

Maps are given lot numbers in bold. In many cases, maps form part of a series, the individual sheets being indented. Offers are invited either for the whole lot - eg 123 (all) - or for a particular sheet - eg 123 sheet 168. In a few instances the same sheet number may appear twice in a list and it will be necessary to state which one is of interest - eg 123 Sheet 168(2). Best offers by **5 Nov** will secure the item. Purchasers are responsible for postage costs, or they can collect from Harmston. It may also be possible to arrange a handover at, for example, Cambridge.

In a few cases, multiple copies are available. It will be assumed that offers are for a single copy unless the contrary is stated.

141. Outline & Water printing - 1000/2/42 LR. Dissected specimen in Stanford maroon globe covers. A crisp printing and actually a rather nice map.

146. GSGS3907 printing - code WO 6000/40 12,000/40/R, 20,000/40/R. Home-made Bender-fold cover.

3. 1:63,360 War Revision 1940.

5th edn sheet 119, print code WO 20,000/40, on cloth, in home-made card covers.

5th edn sheet 119, print code 20,000/11/41 LR, paper, in home-made Bender-fold covers.

5th edn sheet 127, print code 20,000/11/41 LR, cloth, in home-made card covers.

5th edn sheet 136, print code 20,000/12/41 C, paper, in home-made Bender-fold covers'

Another copy, dissected, in Stanford maroon globe covers.

5th edn sheet 144, print code 20,000/1/43 LR. Dissected, in Stanford maroon globe covers.

4. 1:10,560 Brecknockshire 42SW, 1891. Water coloured blue. Dissected, with taped edges, and red diamond bearing sheet title as a sort of integral cover. One fold has failed but is held together by the edge tape.
5. 1:10,560 Caernarvonshire 5SW, partly revised 1937, published 1948. Covers Llandudno Junction and Conway Castle. Some cropping of top margin. On cloth with plain sea-green covers.
6. 1:10,560 Caernarvonshire composite: 6NE&SE + 7NW&SW, 1st edition. 6SE is Reprint 100/1903. Dissected in Stanford cream-marbled covers. MS title on cover "Bangor & Menai Bridges". Pencil notes on the map face give details of the accommodation in Bangor for 16 officers and 457 Other Ranks who are presumably tasked with defending the bridges. Deiniol Road and its connection to the north tip of the cathedral close, already in existence by 1913, are roughly drawn in pencil along with a new building. The cricket ground and the front lawn of the Bishop's Palace are shaded in red - places of assembly?
7. 1:10,560 Gloucs 22 of 1923. Margins trimmed, dissected, in Stanford 'globe' cover. This may have been used by a land agent for Broadwell (Gloucs). Fields in that parish are marked with a letter (indicating tenant?) and in the SE corner and extending into Oddington are notes on fences in 1932-3, including *wire*, the bane of foxhunting.
8. 1:10,560 Lancs 51(all four qtrs) 2nd edn, both the lower quarters having a print date of 1895. Water is tinted blue, roads orange, railway property grey. Three buildings or blocks of building are marked in magenta ink: one has a date (1897) and a 4-digit number that might perhaps relate to some municipal register. Dissected in green covers.
9. 1:10,560 Oxfordshire sheet 53. 1st edn of 1883 with blind stamp May 94, dissected with cream marbled covers, probably by Stanford. A large part of Nettlebed has been coloured to show the lots offered in an auction. Sheet was subsequently owned by the Commons and Footpaths Preservation Soc. Parting at one fold.
10. 1:10,560 Staffs (1st edition). Water in blue. In light blue cloth covers with gilt numbers, probably done for Loxton of Cannock.

45NE reprint 75/97.

45SE reprinted 1895 with a security slip-up: at Fair Oak Colliery No 1, *Magazine* was deleted from the 25" but the 6" was derived photographically from the unredacted drawing, and the name remains. Parting at a fold.

50NE reprinted 1895.

50SE reprint 50/97.

51NW reprint 100/97 with a security slip-up: at both collieries, *Magazine* was deleted from the 25" but the 6" was derived photographically from the unredacted drawing, and the name remains.

51NE reprint 100/97 with a security slip-up: at both collieries, *Magazine* was deleted from the 25" but the 6" was derived photographically from the unredacted drawing, and the name remains.

51SE reprinted 1895.

56SE reprint 75/99.

58NW reprint 75/97. Parting at fold.

11. 1:10,560 Surrey, sheet 23NE of 1920, dissected with dark green cloth covers and Stanford label.

12. 1:10,560 Warwicks (2nd edition) in light blue cloth covers with gilt numbers, done for Loxton of Cannock. (NB. Several of these are joint sheets with Staffs and ought really to be listed under that county, but it is easier to follow the course taken by the original owner.)

4NW, reprint 100/1909. There are pencil annotations (including a long-division) concerned with obtaining accurate lat & long for a point in Rosemary Hill Wood. Houses were built there in the inter-war period; presumably it was one these that was to be fixed.

4NE, reprint 75/08.

4SW, reprint 100/1908. At Great Barr, an Ammunition Factory with its Test Ranges is depicted and named.

4SE, reprint 100/07. Covers Sutton Coldfield.

14. 1:4224, *The Royal Botanic Gardens Kew*, 1972. Plan with alphanumeric squaring, not aligned with north. On reverse, a street plan at about 1:26,250 showing railways (with the old Brentford terminus filled in red but annotated 'disused') and bus routes, along with grid working instructions. Integral cover in green. Price 4p. Tiny hole at the intersection of folds

15. Ditto 1974, price 15p. Pristine.

Scotland

16. 1:63,360 Second Edition, sheet 12 *Campbeltown*, 1896. Outline - ie without hachures. Sheet has been neatly trimmed almost to neatlines and to remove empty sea to the west; details of revision etc have been added neatly in ink. Land above 1000ft has been neatly tinted in brick-red, and the

watershed between E & W coasts drawn unobtrusively in orange. Water has been coloured blue, including (with unfortunate effect) everything between HWM and LWM. Cloth, folded and given 'integral cover'. (Technically I should not have included it in this section, but any purchaser would but it among his maps in covers without a second thought.)

17. 1:63,360 Popular Edition, Sheet 23 *Benbecula*, Outline & Water printing 1/42. (No covers, but sheet appears to have been trimmed with tabs for them and folded accordingly, possibly by a purchaser.)

18. 1:63,360 Popular Edition, War Revision, dissected, in blue-grey card covers.

Sheet 167, print code 15,000/11/48. Benefits from 1947 roads revision.

Sheet 172, print code 15,000/2/48. A bit tatty.

Sheet 187, unique no 1179, print code 10,000/8/50.

21. 1:25,000 Provisional in home-made card covers all vgc.

ST89 B/. Price 2/6 raised to 3/0 by ink stamp.

51.63 B. [=TQ]. The 1951 reprint. Price 2/6 etc raised to 3/0 by ink stamp.

22. 1:10,560 ?1960s, Map of the Phoenix Park, 'Price 1/-'. Integral cover in pale green with historical account on the back cover in the same pale green, a triumph of awful design. The map inside is a standard 6-inch (within the Park only) but printed in black, brown, blue and green (with two densities of screen).

26. 1:253,440 4th edn. As GSGS3957 Second War Revision 1941,

Sheet 12 *England, South East and London*, print code WO 92,300/40, with just a 'W' on the line underneath. No layers. Red Air overprint - Air info to 20.11.39. Cloth. A fire on the heath just E of Bishop's Waltham has caused the loss of a 1"-long section of map, with charring at the edges.

Sheet 12 *England, South East and London*, print code 100,000/12/41 R +. Layered with red Air overprint - Air info to 20.11.39. Has both a Sales copy 3/9 stamp and a red Sales Copy 3s label stuck on with price altered to 3/9. Cloth. Some tears in RH edge.

27. 1:253,440 4th edn with National Grid.

Sheet 8 *Midlands*, D edn, with stamp increasing price to 3/6. A couple of tears in lower margin.

Sheet 8 *Midlands*, as GSGS4628, 40,000/5/48 . Decent condn. (2 copies)

Sheet 10 *England, South West* Outline edition with woods in grey, 1946 (1546/Cr). Thick paper. With stamps raising price to 2/9(?), then 3s.

28. 1:253,440 Geological Survey

Sheet 3 (=1" New Series sheet 39 and everything to N and W of it), 1959, printed 1972.

29. 1:253,440 County Series Indexes showing parishes. Base map in brown , sheetlines and parish boundaries in black.

Berks 1955, with parish boundaries to 10/56. Pristine

Cheshire 1953, with parish boundaries to 4/61. Pristine

Shropshire, 1956, with parish boundaries to 8/60. Pristine

Warwicks, 1953.

Wilts, 1937, with boundaries to 3/49.

30. 1:126,720 Main series

Sheet 14, *Lincoln and Grimsby*, 1914, layered with filled county names. NE corner of the map torn away but only affecting a tiny piece of sea.

Sheet 16, *Wrexham, Shrewsbury*, etc, 1930, 1000/3/42 LR printing - Black Outline. With Note: *An edition of this map is published in colours* is somewhat economical with the truth as the coloured edition was generally unobtainable.

Sheet 24, *Bedford & Cambridge*, 1928, 646 printing. Outline with blue water, thick paper. A red line has been carefully drawn across the map following railways, rivers and, occasionally, roads. Perhaps a hunt boundary.

Sheet 25, *Bury St Edmunds & Ipswich*, 1000/3/42 LR printing - outline with blue water, thick paper. The red line from sheet 24 continues to the sea at the mouth of the R Deben. Price increased by stamp from 1/9 to 2/-.

Sheet 25. Another copy. No red line. Price changed by stamp from 1/9 to 1/6.

31. 1:126,720 *Birmingham District*, 1933. Print code 10,000/34. The new look planned for the half-inch with hill-shading that doesn't quite work.

32. 1:126,720 *Peak District*, 1936. Print code 10039 M38 R37. Layered. Covers a massive area: Nottingham and Burton to Liverpool and Doncaster. A few tears in margin.

33. 1:126,720. County Diagrams. The Half-inch serves as base map, with County Series sheetlines in same colour. In red are the various administrative boundaries - parishes, urban & rural districts, municipal boroughs. Because of the number of changes to administrative boundaries in the inter-war period, the early diagrams can be really useful. On a type of paper that seems immune to tears.

Sussex, 1928. Base in grey, parliamentary divisions in blue. Includes Poor Law Unions. Slight foxing in one corner.

Worcestershire, 1949, updated to 12/56. Base in brown, parliamentary divisions in green. Grey fill for county boroughs, yellow fill for municipal boroughs. With National Grid in black.

34. Simplified form of above without admin boundaries. Base map in grey. National Grid in green with a diagram explaining sheet numbers of maps on National Grid sheetlines (including a 1:500 by photo-enlargement of the 1:1250). County Series sheetlines in red. On ordinary thick paper.

35. 1:100,000 County Indexes relating County Series sheetlines to National Grid. Based on 1-inch. Condition generally good.

36. 1:63,360 Old Series

Sheet 54SE, 1885. A new state with electrotpe date 1885 but Alcester Branch still so named and the East & West Junction Rly has lost its station at Binton. Trimmed. Railways coloured red, water blue, roads brown (the roads perhaps by an amateur hand).

Sheet 61NE state 8, c1850. Trimmed, but a good crisp printing in good condn.

Sheet 63NW, state 10, 1863. epd 12/64. The Leicester - Burton railway and the Ashby de la Zouch canal are coloured blue. Coal pits are shown by brown circles, with names in brown and also their links to the railway or canal. This includes the depiction of a couple of links not on the printed map. Good condn.

Sheet 89SW, State 18, 1875, epd 1876. Ink stamp by Manchester agent Edwin Slater. Numerous black circles may represent coal pits. Railways are coloured red (L&NWR) or blue (L&YR) with both colours side-by-side for the North Union Rly (which was joint). The line from Boars Head to Adlington is also shown in this way, though the continuation is blue.

37. 1:63,360 New Series

Sheet 99 *Chapel en le Frith*, c1908. 3rd edn Outline. Trimmed - right to neatline on S & E sides, presumably to allow it to be pasted on top of adjoining sheets. N & E margins a bit dirty but generally good condn.

Sheet 100 *Sheffield*, c1901. 2nd edn Outline state 7 or 8. Trimmed - right to neatline on S. Grubby margins but otherwise good condn.

Sheet 106 *Bangor*, 1894. 1st edn: Advance Edition by Photozincography. State A3. Holes developing at intersection of folds.

Sheet 108 *Flint*, 1887. 1st edition Outline state 1. epd 9/89. On cloth with Stanford stamp.

Sheet 111, [*Buxton*], 3rd edn Outline, 1907. Trimmed - right to neatline on E side. Grubby margins, otherwise good condn.

Sheet 112 [*Chesterfield*], 3rd edn Outline, State 1, 1908. Trimmed, but not too badly. Slightly grubby margins but generally very good condn.

Sheet 168, *Birmingham*, 1910. 3rd edn. Outline state 3. One small tear, well away from printed area.

Sheet 168 *Birmingham*, 1909. 3rd edn. With brown hills. Cheap copy on thin paper for school use, the school in question being indicated by a label superimposed on the plate. Printing date given as 190_. Pristine.

Composite of 3rd edn Outline sheets 229(2nd, state 1, epd 10.06), 230(2nd, state2, epd 10.06), 246 (3rd, state1), 247 (3rd, state1), of c1907. Llanelly and two zones around it are tinted in different colours, two of the zones being subdivided. Small tears in lower edge.

Composite of 3rd edn Outline sheets 229, 230, 246, 247, of c1912. 230 has epd Jan 1912; 246 has rly revision & minor corrections to 6/12; 247 has rly revn to 11/10. Used by T&C Hawksley, civil engineers to mark their proposals for a new reservoir, etc, to supply Llanelly, which were submitted to the 1913 Parliamentary session.

Sheet 247 *Swansea*, 1910. 3rd edn Outline. Cheap printing for use in schools. This may be a later printing than any recorded hitherto, having CCR and ROW notes. Very worn; held stable with brown paper backing.

38. 1:63,360, 2nd edn material in Outline with brown roads.

(*Gloucester & Cheltenham*, 1906, rlies to Sep 1908(?). On cloth with cream linen covers, but used as stiffening for 5th edn sheet Sheet 146 (qv). Quite usable if held up to the light!)

Leeds District. Railways to 1907. Approx 18x27" - ie LSS size but as portrait sheet. Printed 9.20. For school use. Thin paper such as is often found anyway with this series. Holes developing at intersection of folds.

London, 1899. Rlies to 11/02. Reprint 600/1904. c26x24" cloth. Two horizontal lines have been carefully drawn in red ink, 10 inches apart, whose purpose is unclear.

39. 1:63,360 Popular Edition. A collection of late copies which may (apart from sheet 45) be on the OS answer to Place's waterproof paper: thinner, not quite so tolerant of folding, but seemingly resistant to tears. This may be associated with some of the colour variation noted in Yolande Hodson's monograph.

Sheet 25, *Ribblesdale*. 3500/40 - the last coloured printing.

Sheet 45, *Buxton & Matlock*, 3200/34. This appears to be on Place's Waterproof Paper. A previous owner appears to have pasted blue card to serve as a front and back cover, but the face of the map remains in very good condition.

Sheet 64 *Peterborough*, 2040 print code - final coloured printing.

Sheet 69, *Llanidloes*, 2039 print code. Trimmed by a user - not too severely.

Sheet 83, *Northampton*, 3036 - last coloured printing.

Sheet 107, *NE London & Epping Forest*, 8000/34.

40. 1:63,360 Popular Edition. Outline & Water printings.

Sheet 13 *Kirkby Stephen and Appleby*, 1000/11/41 LR. Good-quality paper, good condn.

Sheet 18 *Wasdale*, 1000/11/41 LR. Includes War Revision updates. Good-quality paper, but something has nibbled at one edge.

Sheet 20 *Kirkby Lonsdale & Hawes*, 1000/11/41 LR. Good-quality paper, good condn.

Sheet 25 *Ribblesdale*, 1000/11/41 LR. Good-quality paper.

Sheet 30 *Blackburn*, 1000/11/41 LR. Includes War Revision updates. Dissected by purchaser.

Sheet 59 *Dolgelley & Lake Vrynwy*, 1000/11/41 LR. Includes War Revision updates. Good-quality paper, trimmed but not too badly.

Sheet 60 *Shrewsbury & Welshpool*, 1000/11/41 LR. Includes War Revision updates. Good-quality paper.

Sheet 61 *Wolverhampton*, 1000/11/41 LR. Lacks War Revision updates. Good-quality paper. Coloured and gridded (WOFO in grey) by purchaser, 1943. The colouring is well done but the division between red and yellow roads is non-standard: is this the purchaser's own classification?

Sheet 61 *Wolverhampton*, 600/11/43 Ch. Inferior paper. Sales printing of 2nd War Revn.

Sheet 62 *Burton & Walsall*, 600/11/43 Ch. Inferior paper. Sales printing of 2nd War Revn.

Sheet 65 *Wisbech & King's Lynn*, 1000/11/41 LR. Includes War Revision updates. Good-quality paper but with bite taken out of edge.

Sheet 70 *Bishop's Castle*, 1000/4/42 LR. Purchased Sep 42. Thin paper but in decent condn.

Sheet 71 *Kidderminster*, 1000/11/41 LR. Includes War Revision updates. Good-quality paper, but exposure folded has led to two panels becoming browned and a fold starting to fail.

Sheet 81 *Worcester*, 600/11/43 Ch. Inferior paper. Sales printing of 2nd War Revn. Decent condn.

Sheet 82 *Stratford on Avon*, 1000/11/41 LR. Includes War Revision updates. Good-quality paper.

Sheet 105 *Oxford & Henley on Thames*, WO 20,000/9/41. Includes War Revision updates. Good-quality paper. Red staining on one panel where a home-made cover seems to have been attached.

40a *Cheltenham & District* Tourist Map, 1922, print code 6000/42 LR. Stamp raising price to 2/6. A remarkably large and late printing of this attractive layered map. The yellow roads are now a rather ruddy brown and as a consequence the tidal reaches of the Severn around Frampton are reddish in colour. The Equipment Supply Depot at RAF Quedgeley appears in its WW1 form as a shell-filling factory. The Luftwaffe had already noticed its appearance on the 1-inch before the war and had speculated that there was a shell-filling factory hidden underneath the depot. Small holes at the intersection of folds.

41. 1:63,360 5th edn.

Sheet 138 *Exeter* in Relief form, print code 5200/33, the initial printing. Has been folded gently; has also been pinned up on a wall. Edges of the paper, well away from the map, have been rucked up a bit, and a small piece has been taken out, but this could be trimmed off. The map within the neatline is still a joy to behold.

Sheet 146 [*Land's End & Lizard*] in non-relief form, extract including whole of land area west of Lizard and Redruth. It appears to have been trimmed to fit a copy of 2nd edn District sheet *Gloucester & Cheltenham* (qv) on which it was mounted. A tear in the sea area was carefully repaired before mounting.

42. 1:63,360 5th edn. Special sheet *Farnborough*. OS 1933, print code CR 4275, 10,000/34, 4000/35. Covers Farnham to Bracknell, Odiham to Guildford. Military version in black, blue, brown & purple, with grid figures at 5km intervals. Map is drawn to the early 5th edn specification, with the line to RAE Farnborough shown as a mineral line (no fills to chequer). Comparing against the 5th edn of 1934, Cove is still a separate parish, and there is no tcb by the West Heath railway bridge. The diagram of adjoining sheets is basically of the small-sheet series but 130 is shown with the same N-S dimensions as 131; however, overlaps seem to be drawn carelessly. The grid working instructions are based on POLAND; this turns out to be a hamlet north of Odiham.

42a. 1:63,360 5th edn. Special sheet *Aldershot Command*, GSGS3907, print code WO 17036. Red overprint showing boundary of area. State is known only from a private collection and is earlier than any MBS printing in BL. On Place's waterproof paper.

43. 1:63,360 GSGS 3907: Popular (Pop), War Revision (WR), or Second War Revision (2WR)

5 *Solway Firth & River Esk*, WO 6000/40. WR. LH & top margins trimmed, not too badly. Blank paper torn away on bottom LH corner.

6 *Hexham*, WO 45,000/4/41. 2WR. Cloth. Good condn. OHMS label on reverse indicates that 50 copies were sent to RE unit concerned.

9 *Carlisle*, 20,000/10/41 LR. 2WR. Good condn.

12 *Keswick & Ambleside*, WO 6000/40. WR. Cloth. Paper worn away at intersection of folds.

42 *Llandudno & Denbigh*, WO 9000/40. WR. Red Sales Copy label has been stuck on rather than stamped. Decent condn.

44 *Northwich & Macclesfield*, WO 30,000/8/41. WR. Good condn.

49 *Portmadoc & Criccieth*, WO 20,000/40. WR. Red Sales Copy sticker. Cloth. Tear developing in LH margin.

58 *Cromer*, WO 850/32. Pop. No green plate. Red & blue pencil lines, perhaps for some exercise. Cloth.

82 *Stratford on Avon*, 20,000/11/41 LR. WR. Coming apart at fold.

92 *Gloucester & Forest of Dean*, 41,650/1/43 R. WR. Version with grid. Sales copy stamp. Good condn.

95 *Luton*, 20,000/8/44 Ch. 2WR. Sales Copy & Revised Price stamps. Good condn. (2 copies)

97 *Colchester*, WO 8000/40 (not previously recorded). Pop. Cloth. Decent condn.

112 *Marlborough*, WO 12,000/39. Pop. Base map with parish bdies of course. Coming apart at fold.

121. *Wells & Frome*, 22,050/8/44 B. 2WR

124 *Guildford & Horsham*, no code, WR. Version with multi-colour *relation of grid letters and sheet numbers* diagram and no OS road revision date. Cloth. Good condn.

138 *Exeter*, 20,000/4/42 LR. WR. Red Sales copy stamp.

139 *Sidmouth & Bridport*, 50,000/6/42 LR. 2WR. Red Sales Copy sticker. Decent condn.

44. 1:63,360 Geological Survey

Sheet 152 *Shrewsbury*, 1932, printed 1962. Still on 3rd edn base. Solid.

Sheet 167 *Dudley*, 1939, printed 1963. Solid with Drift.

Sheet 182 *Droitwich*, 1960, printed 1962. Solid & Drift.

Sheet 1734 I, *Kvænangen*, 1955, partly revised 1963, printed 10/73. Kvænangen is a parish and has a parish church sitting on a small island with no roads, just a few cart tracks. But on the east side of the fjord is European Highway No 6, where a late sometime Publications Manager of the Society drove into a ditch. When the map was revised, the road still had a gravel surface.
