### **PRELIMINARY NOTES**

1. Bids are the amount you will pay if successful (like a tender). Doing it otherwise is too difficult when bidding on certain items may be sparse.

An attractive topographic map, hill-shaded, with 4 different colours for land-use and a near absence of tourist-type symbols. Those parts of Austria and Switzerland within the rectangular area depicted are shown in the same style. With Swiss 1km-grid.

9. Landeskarte, 1:25k, 1952. A reprint of the Swiss LT map. Detail in Switzerland and Austria is simplified. (This actually makes for a much clearer depiction of Swiss parish boundaries than on the modern map.) Pasted card covers.

10. Wanderkarte, 1:25k, 1994. A reprint of the Swiss LT map, with waymarked footpaths; lots of very basic information printed on the reverse. Those parts of Austria and Switzerland within the rectangular area depicted are shown in the same style.

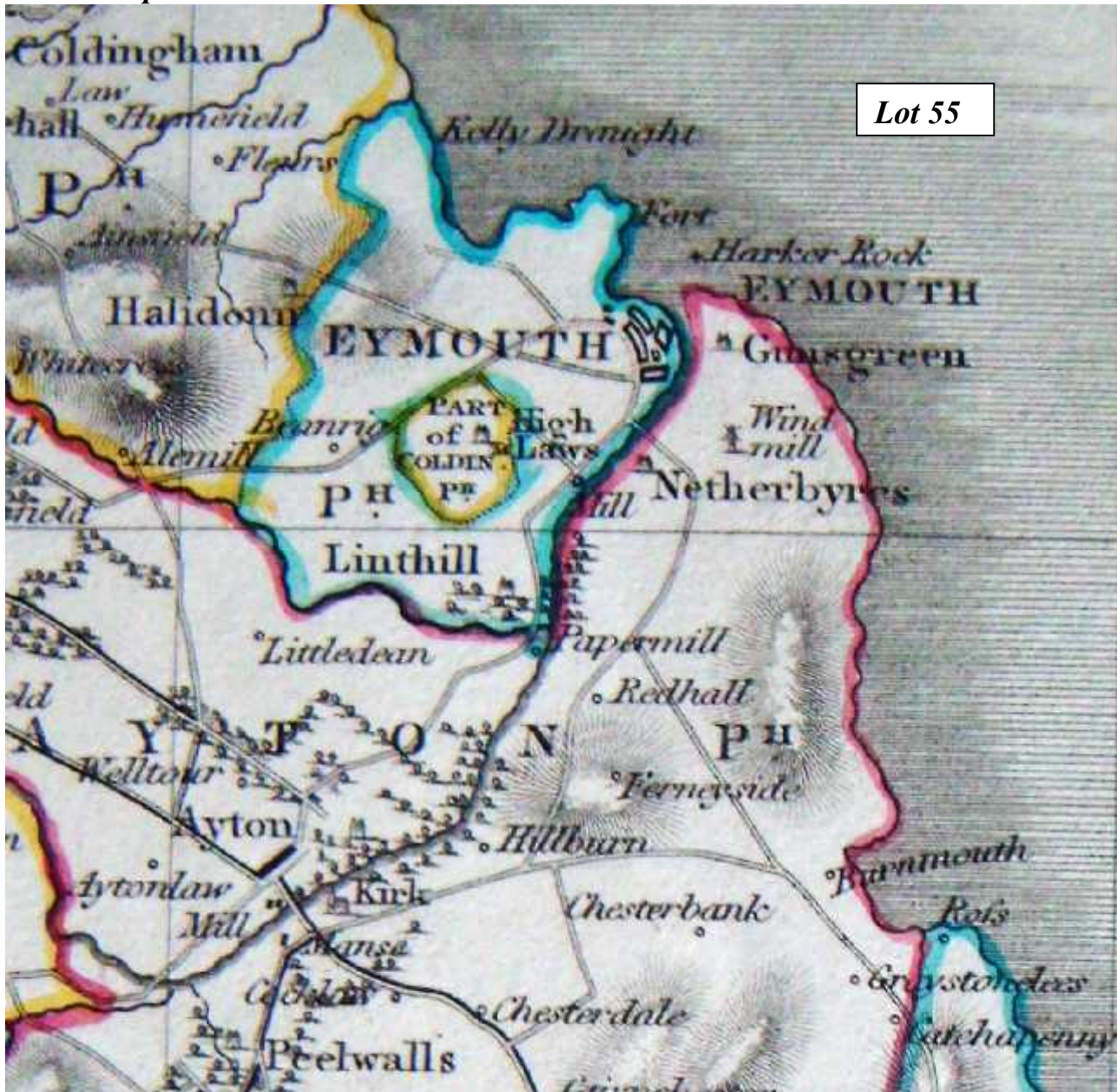
52. Admiralty Chart 1333, *New Hebrides Islands and New Caledonia*, 1899. Folded centrally. Paper damaged at bottom, outside neat line.

53. *A map of the estate of Bonham Carter Esq, MP, in the parish of Buriton, Hants.* 6 chains to inch. 1858 (watermark). 42"x28". 'Traced from Tithe map' [of 1840, G Doswell] and lithographed. Roads are coloured in brown, buildings in carmine, water in blue. The railway (L&SWR, opened 1859) is shown by its property boundary only (plus tunnel portals, but without any depiction of the earthworks); in contrast, a tramway linking it to lime kilns is shown. Cream chart paper. There are a few small tears at the edge of the paper, of which one extends beyond the neat line, but this and one other have been repaired by reinforcing paper on the back; otherwise a bright and attractive map.

54. Yeakell & Gardner, *The Fourth Sheet of an Actual Topographical Survey of the County of Sussex*, 1:31680 [1783], (Rye to Pevensey). Folded once vertically, with creases from old horizontal folds; there is one 12 cm tear and one 8 cm tear along these creases, fortunately within the sea; an area about 4 cm x 3 cm top-centre is missing. Map is cropped to within 7mm of neat line; there are numerous worm-holes. *See photo above*



55. John Thomson, *Berwickshire*, 1821. c 1:91k. A plan of Berwick is inset. Hachured, with roads; churches, castles, country houses shown by pictorial symbol. Parish outlines coloured. Thomson's maps are generally regarded as the best record of their counties prior to the Ordnance Survey. One of the *attestors* is J Blackadder, Land Sur'r. Condition: a nice bright copy, not too closely trimmed, so plate edges are visible except at top; there are small tears at the edge of the paper, none extending within the neat line. *See photo above*.

56. John Thomson, *Buteshire*, 1823. c 1:85k. Hachured, with roads; churches, castles, country houses shown by pictorial symbol. Parish outlines coloured (all 4 of them). Watermark 1821. Has been removed from an atlas, having a central fold. One corner creased outside the neat line, otherwise good condition.

57. William Roy, *Plan de la bataille de Tonhausen près de Minden* (1759). Shows topography and the successive positions of troops from 14 Jul to 2 Aug, with the aid of two *papillons* or flaps. Unit symbols are coloured. There is a splendid cartouche with a martial lion making use of French banners as a door-mat and there is a long account of the battle: I cannot find any account in it of how a certain Captain William Roy distinguished himself, but there is perhaps an oblique reference intelligible to those more fully aware of the circumstances. The map is dedicated to his commander, Prince Ferdinand, Duke of Brunswick. This appears to be the engraved version of the map that made Roy's reputation - see Hewitt p46 - or rather the Dutch version, engraved by Jacob van Schley. Paper is watermarked 'D&C Blauw'. Condition: 1 vertical fold with faint creases from earlier folding; a couple of small tears, one penetrating 1mm within the neat line; detail of the map is crisp and bright. 62. IGN, *Topografische Atlas België*, c2009. Whole country at 1:50k, with Flemish/French notes on IGN products. As new. Hbk, 356pp. As a road atlas, suffers from the tendency of maps to disappear into gutters and its sheer weight (2.4kg).

63. *Luftbildatlas Bayern*, 1973. Hbk 177pp. 72 stunning obliques, each with a page of text offering a serious analysis of how the town (if that is what is shown) has developed and how it functions at present.

64. William C Brice, *An Historical Atlas of Islam* (Leiden, 1981) 11"x16", 72pp. A wide span, 150 AD to contemporary, but with emphasis on the medieval and early modern period.

65. A Herrman, *Historical and Commercial Atlas of China* (Harvard UP, 1930) 112 pp; backing strip starting to come away. The index is linked to a 6-page list of 2922 Chinese characters so that the user can recognise a name, but these are not used on the maps in the atlas.
