Bids are invited for the following lots.

### PRELIMINARY NOTES

1. Bids are the amount you will pay if successful (like a tender). Doing it otherwise is too difficult when bidding on certain items may be sparse.
2. P&P is to be paid by the bidder. A book typically costs about £2.80; there is a jump to £5.79 at the 2kg point. Collection from Harmston is of course free.
3. Items where bids fall short of the sum that the Committee believes can be obtained by an alternative route may be withdrawn from the sale.
4. Bids must be received by **25 July** at the latest. However, if the leading bidder for an item is attending the Mansfield visit on 14 July, such items may be dealt with on that day to save carriage and packing.

### PART 1: NEW MAPS - ie not previously offered - (FOLDED)

#### **OS**

1. 1:633,600 *Map of the Canals & navigable Rivers in the Catchment Basins of England and Wales* [Royal Commission on Canals and Waterways, Vol III] *Plate No 4 (Sheet 2)* (from Boston southwards), [1908]. Catchment areas are coloured (screened colour). Derelict canals and those converted into railways are included. Rainfall statistics are given, as are spot heights on watersheds. See Hellyer, *Ten-Mile Maps*, p85.
2. *A Plan of Part of the Town of Cambridge for the International Geographical Congress 1928* 1:5280. Printed in black and blue with red used for four buildings of particular interest to the delegates. At first sight, this looks like an enlargement of the six-inch (1925 revision) but closer inspection reveals that certain text has been cleaned off (like H.M. PRISON, which might perhaps give delegates the wrong impression). With EM cover.
3. *Town Map of Norwich*, 1:10,560, 1932. Direct-printed cover in red with official Royal Arms. "Produced by direct untouched transfer from the normal Six-inch sheets and printed on cheap paper". Good condition, except for a route marked in red pencil.

#### **OSI**

4. 1:250k, Sh 1, Ireland, North West, 2nd edn, 1966.
5. 1:250k *Ireland, South, Holiday Map*. One of a layered 4-sheet series covering whole island. Despite the title, this is pukka 1:250k cartography.

UK



6. *Smith's New Map of England and Wales with part of Scotland*, c1:625k, 1806. Distinguishes mail-coach roads, turnpike roads, principal cross-roads (not turnpike) and other roads, also navigable canals. Includes Scotland up to Edinburgh and Glasgow and the eastern fringe of Ireland. Map is packed with detail, some of which is simply wrong: for example, the Caistor Canal has been extended to Nettleton (notwithstanding the 171ft hill in the way) and the Humber Bridge has been anticipated by 170 years! Dissected with marbled boards and provided with a slip case. Good condition; finding errors offers hours of fun for all the family! **(Photo above)**

7. John Albin, *Isle of Wight*, 1:63,360, 1795. Marks the meridian of Portsmouth Academy. Plan of



Newport. Woods and parks are hand-coloured in green. The boundaries of West Medine and East Medine have been inexpertly coloured and various roads have been marked in. Dissected, in a somewhat decayed slip case.



8. Isaac Taylor, *County of Gloucester*, 2 miles to inch, 1800, with plan of Gloucester. Roads are hand-coloured in brown, parks in green, Hundreds are edged in various colours, and the whole county is given a neutral tint. Blank spaces are filled with historical notes in a hand of the 1st half of the 19th c. - mostly key dates from 577 to 1688, also a list of ?archaeological sites. Some names of streams have been added. In a different ink, some routes have been marked in. Map was dissected and sold in a slip case by Faden. Cloth has worn through at corners of panels but map is basically sound. **(Photo above)**

9. Greenwood, Pringle & Co, *County of Salop*, 1:63,360, 1827. Hundreds delicately tinted and outlined in colour; roads in brown, parks in green. View of Shrewsbury by Creighton with boats on the river. Dissected with marbled front & back. Some offset visible in white areas of map, but generally a nice specimen.

### GSGS

10. GSGS2555 Asia 1:1M. Sheet North K 36 (Sinob - N central Turkey) 1916. Dissected in Sifton Praed covers.

11. GSGS 2563 *Lower Mesopotamia between Baghdad and the Persian Gulf*, 1:1M, Nov 1907 updated to Aug 1916. Numerous printed annotations, eg at Baghdad 'Ruined mud walls, mostly destroyed'. Dissected in Stanford book-fold covers.

GSGS2733 NW Europe, 1:250k

12. Sheet 1 and part of 4, Revised edition, Feb 1915. Key for roads distinguishes 'main, macadamised' from 'main, paved' (ie pavées). An interesting map: one is struck by the amazing double ring of forts around Antwerp and by the direct railway line from Bruges to Brussels (S) being shown as under construction E of Aalst. This is the sheet that started life as GSGS2733b - see Sheetlines 39, p34. Cloth, direct-printed cover.

13. Sheet 3, May 1918. Cloth, direct-printed cover; George Philip sticker inside. This is a westward extension of GSGS2733 across GSGS2738 territory, being aligned with the other 2733 sheets and drawn in the same style, except that the 'main, paved' symbol has disappeared all main roads being described (implausibly) as macadamised.

#### GSGS2738 France 1:250k

14. Sheet 1a, 1914. The early version based on the French Type 1880. E Kent is shown but in outline only. Cloth, direct-printed cover bearing an official stamp dated 23.1.18.

15. Sheet 1A, September 1917. This is the version John Cruickshank describes (Sheetlines 39, p34) where he notes that it includes England S & E of London, specially drawn at 1:250k. More important for its intended users, it has been redrawn in the style of GSGS2733 (except that the pavé symbol has been dropped (presumably the information was not available); the sheetlines are aligned with those of 2733. The style used for the English detail is based on that used in France but the detail is not so fine.

#### GSGS2758 Europe 1:1M.

16. Sheet North L 32 (Milano). 2nd Provisional edn (boundaries as at Jul 1914). Drawn & printed by OS. Dissected in Stanford's leatherette covers.

17. Sheet North L 33 (Triest). Drawn & printed by OS 1915, railways to 10.4.19, international boundaries to 1926. Dissected in Sifton Praed marbled covers.

18. GSGS2871 Africa 1:2M Sheet North I 34-35 / H 34-35 (Cyrenaica). Conveniently covers most of African campaign of WW2. Dissected in Stanford's leatherette covers.

19. GSGS3859 (M893) Malta & Gozo, Sheet 1 (Gozo), 1:31,680, printed No 1 SPC, 1958. No covers.

20. GSGS 4338, Ireland (LSS), Sh 7 Cork & Kerry, 1st edn Ground/Air, 1942. With 'Sales Copy' stamp, on cloth, and provided (by purchaser) with a card book-fold cover.

#### Survey of India

21. 1:4.25M, *India showing Railways*, 1929. The various states and provinces are shown by different tints. Inserts at scales as large as 1-inch show congested areas. Paper in book-fold cover showing a train emerging from a tunnel. Map vgc, cover a little battered with ink stains.

22. 1:4M, *Indian Explorers of the 19th Century*, 1990. Simple map of NW Frontier and much of Afghanistan with routes taken by four of the great Indian explorers.

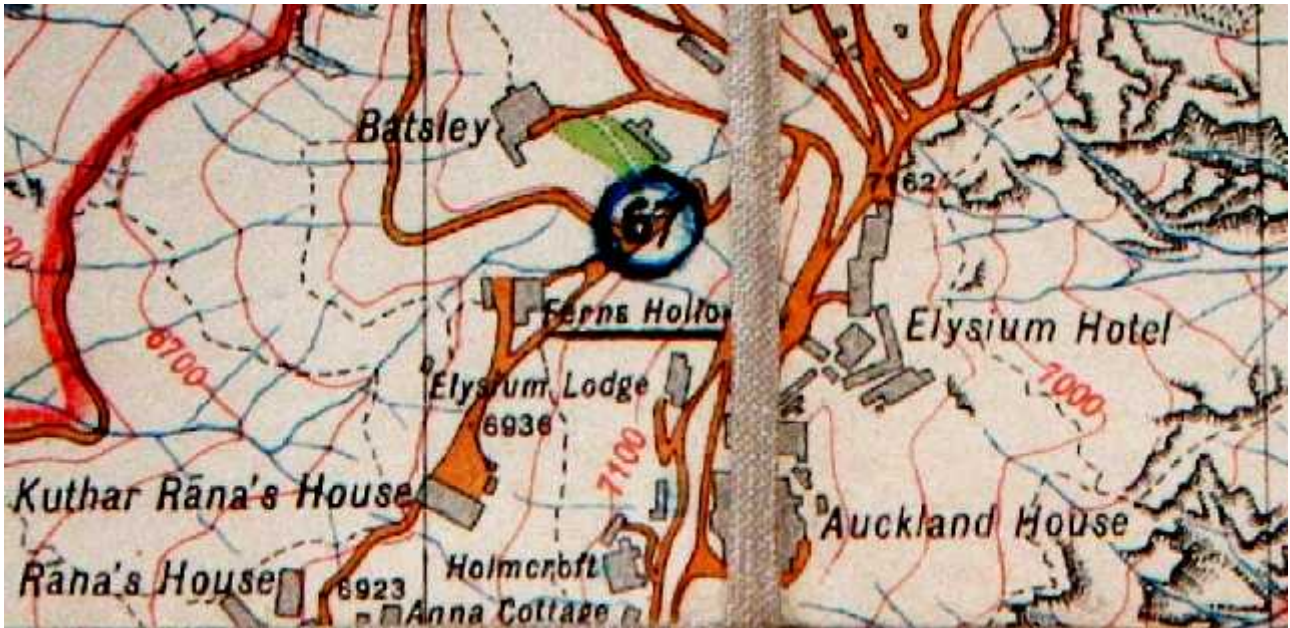
23. 1:3.168M, Road Map of India, 6th edn (1942) reprinted 1945. Paper in rigid blue book-fold covers.

24. IMW, 1:1M. Sheet N. B-44 *Ceylon*. 1928. Sticks rigidly to graticule, so northern tip of Ceylon is excluded and quite a lot of empty ocean is included. Dissected in Sifton Praed leatherette covers.

25. 1:1M, Sheet N. H-42 *Sulaiman Mountains*, 1929. Extends from Punjab to edge of Afghanistan. Dissected in Sifton Praed leatherette covers.
26. 1:1M. *Central Provinces*, 1924. With small inset so that whole of Central Provinces fit on the sheet. Dissected. Linen weak: the panel corresponding to one end paper is detached, and the other has a tear between panels. There is a pencil note of 1957 regarding a USSR (-run?) steelworks.
27. 1:1M, Sh 9, *Tehran*, 1917. Includes Isfahan. Linen. Worn.
28. 1:1M Sh 35&36, Karachi, 1926. Linen with pasted covers.
29. 1:1M Sh 40, Hyderabad, 1926. Linen with pasted covers.
30. 1:1M Sh 53, Delhi, 1929. Cloth with pasted covers; folds a bit worn.
31. 1:253,440 Sh 38N (*Peshawar*), 1942 printing of 1941 interim edn. Paper.
32. 1:253,440 Sh 43J (*Srinagar*), 1922. Cloth, with pasted covers.
33. 1:253,440 Sh 43M, 1933. A diagram of 'Areas of Doubtful Accuracy' lists sources, including exploration surveys of 1892 and 1903, whose routes are shown on map. Cloth, with pasted covers.
34. 1:253,440 Sh 43N, 1938. Part of Ladakh with mountains rising to 19,620ft. The valleys carefully surveyed; the high mountains to about the standard acceptable in England in 1738. Cloth.
35. 1:253,440 Sh 48M (*Dharwar*), 1934. Dissected in book-fold cover.
36. 1:253,440 Sh 53O, 1946 gridded. Dissected in cream book-fold cover. Cover hinge has separated in part.
37. 1:253,440 Sh 73M, 1936. Linen in stiff book-fold covers with 'Degree Sheet' label.
38. 1:253,440 Sh 78E, *Punakha*, 1934. Maps has areas accurately surveyed, with contours, and other areas with just form-lines Shows the southern end, at Phari Dzong, of the "Kalimpong-Lhasa trade route". Paper, in book-fold covers. Cover a little battered but map in very good condition.
39. 1:126,720, Sh 43J(NE), 1921. Linen, no covers.
40. 1:126,720, Sh 43J(SW), 1921. Linen, no covers. A name underlined in red pencil.
41. 1:126,720, Sh 43J(SE), 1928. Includes Srinagar. Linen, with pasted malachite-marbled front cover. A few names underlined in ink. A brown stain affects about 3 sq cm.
42. 1:126,720, Sh 43O(NE), 1923. Linen, no covers.
43. 1:126,720, Sh 65D(SW), Guntur, 1932. Dissected in stiff salmon book-fold covers. Excellent condn.
44. 1:126,720, Sh 65D(SE), 1932. Kistna River. Dissected in stiff salmon book-fold covers. vgc.

45. 1:126,720, Sh 66A(NW), 1931. A coastal sheet. Dissected in stiff salmon book-fold covers. vgc.
46. 1:126,720, *Mt Everest & Environs* (parts of 71L&P, and 72 I&M). Mag Dev date 1925. Extends well into Tibet - as far as 28°20'N. Shows routes of 1921-24 expeditions. Cloth, with rigid end-panels.
47. 1:63,360, *Calcutta and Adjacent Country*, Section 1. 3rd Edn with Mag Dev date 1883. This section covers the Hooghly River to the north of the single-sheet 1920 edition below and includes the great Hooghly bridge. Dissected, with marbled end-panels. Linen is weak: map has separated into 2 pieces and other tears between panels are developing.
48. 1:63,360, *Calcutta and Adjacent Country*, 1920. With alphanumeric squaring in grey. Inset is a railway map of Bengal at 128 miles to inch. Dissected in stiff book-fold covers.
49. 1:63,360, Sh38 N4, 1909 corrected to 1917. 'Official Use Only'. Includes part of Kabul River. A small area is marked 'unsurveyed'. Paper, generally sound but with a couple of small tears as though something had stuck to reverse. Pasted brown covers.
50. 1:63,360, Sh53 P7, *Bareilly District*. 1913. Dissected. in pasted card covers. Good condition.
51. 1:63,360, Sh 54 L 1,2,5&6, 1926. Includes Lalitpur and valley of R. Betwa. A composite, sold as such by the Survey. Dissected in book-fold cover. Cover has small tears and panels do not lie as flat as they should, but linen is sound. A nice map to look at.
52. 1:63,360, Sh 78 J 5&9, 1928. Preliminary Editions. Both maps have substantial extrusions covering part of 78 I 8&12; this is in Bhutan and may represent the limits of the area mapped. Dissected with pasted covers.
53. 1:50k *Mt Everest*, 1990. Special map to mark 200th anniversary of Sir George Everest's birth. Based on SPOT imagery with contours overlaid. With it are 4 computer-generated 3-D views. Oblique aerial view on cover; on reverse portraits of Sir George and other relevant individuals.
54. 1:15,840, Dehli and Vicinity, 1922, Sheets 1 &2, covering the old city and the area to its north. Dissected, with pasted card covers.





55. 1:7920, *Guide Map of Simla*, 1917, with index listing each house or institution. Map has been annotated, the municipality having been divided into 11 sectors with around ten numbered points in each sector. The cover is marked 'Adjutant'. Has it been used for some military purpose? Dissected. (Photo above)

### Michelin

56. Sheet 152, Sahara, 1:4M, 1958. Has much unusual information, such as whether there are Europeans in a settlement, whether aviation fuel can be obtained, etc.

57. Sheet 175, Ivory Coast, 1:800k, 1978. With climate table (principally to show wet/dry seasons).

### Belgium

58. IGM 1:250k, 1964. Double-sided, covering whole country, with Luxemburg and adjoining parts of Fr, Ge, NL. Direct-printed cover.

59. IGN 1:100k Sh 116 *Esneux - St Vith*, 1988. The normal topographic map is on one side. On the reverse is a version in grey outline with overprints showing recommended tours by car, long-distance footpaths, interesting churches. Oddly, names of ex-communes appear in red on this version. As new.

IGM 1:25k, with tri-lingual legend. Direct-printed cover.

60. Sh 43/5-6 (ie 43SW) *Limbourg - Eupen*, 1959.

61. Sh 67/1-2 (ie 67NW) *Bouillon - Dohan*, 1968.

### Brazil

62. American Geographical Society of New York, South America 1:1M, sheet S D-22 (Goyaz), 1935. Provisional edition (of IMW?). The reliability diagram is frightening: a very few 'reliable traverses' with much of the map filled in from descriptive notes. It comes as a shock to discover that Brasilia is just about at the SE corner of the map.

### Cameroun

63. IGN, Sheet NC-33/34 -N.O. (Maroua), 1:500k, 1st edn, Sep 1964. Adjoining countries shown in outline only. In card wallet. Worn at folds. Annotated in biro with approx boundaries of some ?estates.

### **Cape Verde Islands**

64. MapAlliance, 1:150k, 2001. 2-sided map showing all the islands. Carefully contoured, other features coarser. Integral covers. vgc.

### **China**

65. Xi'an Cartographic, 1:100k, K2 (Mount Qogori), no date. Detailed cartography both sides of the border (which is not actually shown).

### **Cyprus**

66. Survey of Cyprus Motor Map, 1:506,880 with insets of towns at 1:36,680, 1951. Printed by OS; card cover has 'official' Royal Arms above a sketch with camels crossing a bridge.

67. Clyde Surveys, Leisure map of Cyprus, c1980, 1:300k with enlargements of towns.

68. Kort & Matrikelstyrelsen, 1:300k, The Øresund Region, 2000. Centred on Copenhagen.

### **Egypt**

75. Bartholomew World Travel Series, 1:1M, 1978. The title is not quite accurate: the W and S fringes of the country are omitted.

76. Survey of Egypt, *Cairo*, 1:15k, 1920. Good detail. Badly worn at folds. No covers.

### **Finland**

Maanmittaushallitus, 1:200k Motoring map. With insets of towns, about as coarse as those on OS 4th edn quarter-inch. Multi-lingual legend.

77. Sh 2, with Helsinki near SE corner, 1967.

78. Sh 4, centred on Tampere, 1965.

79. Sh 5, centred on Mikkeli, 1966.

80. Special sheet *Tampere*, 1967. Nice cartography, showing 5 terrain types - if one can work out what the Finnish means.

### **France**

Carte de France, Service Vicinale 1:100k

83. Sheet XIV-38, 1901. This is a most unusual sheet in that, apart from a small area south of Salau (Ariège) the map is of Spain, with relief drawn in a manner much more appropriate to the scale than in France. Depiction of settlements and roads in Spain bears no relationship to the map's key and appears to be taken from a map at a scale of 1:250k or smaller. Dissected in Stanford covers.

84. Sheet XVII-12 (Senlis), 1892. In Hachette stiff book-fold covers

85. IGN, *Lille et son agglomération*, 1:13k, 2000. A large and detailed 2-sided street plan that folds out from the back of a 64p booklet with index to streets etc. The stiff front cover of the booklet folds out to provide a useful plan of the city centre. The main plan appears so unsuited for actual use that this may well be a rare specimen in near-pristine condition.

### **Hong Kong**

86. Hong Kong Govt, *Hong Kong, Kowloon and the New Territories*, 1:50k, Revised to 1978. In 2 sheets. No covers. No detail within mainland China.

### **India (other than Survey of India)**

95. *Bartholomew's Contoured Road Map*, 1:4M. Layered, with insets of Calcutta, Bombay, Madras. A symbol shows 'places where petrol can usually be had'. Thus a road is shown to Kabul (and beyond) but no petrol beyond Peshawar. Dissected with pasted covers.

96. US Army Map Service, 1:250k, Sh NI 43-2, *Gilgit*, 1963. Part of Kashmir/Pakistan border. A couple of names underlined. Wear at corners.

97. J&C Walker, *The Indian Atlas*, 1:253,440 Sheets 62 (1829) and 63 (1840), covering the area from Cochin down to India's southern tip at Cape Comorin. Engraved, with relief shown by hachures. Boundaries of states colour-washed; internal administrative boundaries are coloured more finely. The sheets, 40"x26", are dissected, with sewn borders, and come in a half-morocco folder.

Described at the time as "the greatest geographical work ever undertaken". Good condition. A bound set of 24 maps, mostly of 1827-30, was estimated to fetch £700-1000 at auction in 2006.

### **Iran**

98. Ahab, Map No 2, 1:250k, *Tehran & Environs*, 1967 A topographical map, rather coarsely drawn but with detailed contouring. Two more finely drawn insets show the centre at c1:48k and 'Tehran & Suburbs' at 1:250k, the latter being much more up-to-date than the main map. Printed in brown & blue.

### **Kenya**

99. Survey of Kenya, *Tourist Map of Mount Kenya National Park and Environs*, 1:125k, 1974. Printed for DOS by OS. With numbered A, B, C, D, and E-roads, all in different colours; hill-shaded and contoured.

100. Survey of Kenya, *Nairobi & Environs*, 1:100k, 1978. Layered, hill-shaded and contoured.

101. Survey of Kenya, *City of Nairobi*, 1:20k, 1968. Shows interesting industrial estate design whereby each plot has road access at front, railway siding at back.

102. Survey of Kenya, *Nairobi National Park*, 1:25k, 1966, reprinted 4/80. Somewhat coarse cartography.

### **Malaya**

109. Survey Dept, 1:12,672, *Town of Kuala Lumpur shewing numbers of residential quarters*, 1925. Water in blue, main roads in brown and buildings in red. Thus if one is staying at No 632 one can see it is directly opposite the Decrepit Tamils' Depot, with the Lepers Asylum just up the road. Linen with stiff pasted covers.

### **Malta**

110. Bacon's one-inch map of Malta, based on DOS mapping of 1962. Somewhat coarse.

111. Allied Malta Newspapers, Ltd, *Malta, Gozo & Comino*, 1:32k, c1975. Based on DOS mapping: looks a bit like a reduced OS 1:25k but without field boundaries.

### **Morocco**

112. Min of Agriculture, *Plan Urbain - Tanger*, 1:10k, 1974. Covers a mix from agricultural land, through modern suburbs to the ancient Medina: quite a challenge, which it meets fairly well.

113. Deutscher Alpenverein, etc, 1:25k, *Chomolongma - Mount Everest*, 1957. Drawn by Freytag-Berndt. Very detailed compilation notes, eg rock faces drawn using photos from Indian Air Force. Paper, in Alpenverein loose cover.

114. Nepal Survey Dept, 1:50k Sh 2786 03 (Namche Bazar) 1996. Small portion of China on the sheet is left blank. As new.

115. Nepal Survey Dept, 1:50k Sh 2786 04 (Sagarmatha) 1997. Small portion of China on the sheet is left blank.

116. Forschungsunternehmen Nepal Himalaya, 1:50k, *Khumbu Himal*, 1965. Covers area from Namche Bazar up to Mt Everest. Chinese territory is mapped to poorer resolution.

117. National Geographic, 1:50k, *Mount Everest*, 1988. Covers Chinese side as well. On reverse a computer-generated oblique.

118. National Geographic, 1:50k, *Mount Everest*, 1991. 2nd edn with new reverse - a 1:25k of the summit area with the routes taken in various ascents.

119. Sh 1, Kathmandu Valley, 1:50k, 1977. Printed by Bayerisches LV.

120. Sh 9, *Annapurna*. 1:100k, 1993. Has the look of a German walking map, except that there is a separate tint for cultivated land, and the contour values and intervals turn out to be somewhat greater than one would find in the Alps.

121. National Geographic, 1:125k Sh 3002 *Kumbu*, 2000. Covers Mt Everest, the trail to Everest Base Camp, and much else. On reverse a general map of Nepal and a plan of Kathmandu. Map stops at Chinese border. Tear-resistant.

122. Topografische Dienst, 1:250k, Amsterdam, 1964. From a series on graticule-based sheetlines (2 deg x 1 deg) but no system of sheet numbers.
